





1 in 5 students at UGA experience food insecurity






Farm to Campus Market

















The Composting Process

Waste diverted from landfill in 2023







Athens Population is food insecure

24% of Athen's children are food insecure

- High levels of poverty
- Access to nutritious food
- Effects on overall health







One of the best adaptive strategies is to **anticipate the change**.




Futures Thinking
